## **Biodiversity**

Biodiversity is an increasingly important theme throughout our country, including in our neighbourhood. With the hot summers, greenery in the city and village is very important, so it stays cooler. With heavy rainfall, soil and greenery are important for water processing. There are fewer and fewer insects and bees, let's do our best to get them back.

Let's be aware of the biodiversity in our neighbourhood. We've been getting a few things done lately. Beehives will soon be installed in our public orchard with underplanting of insectattracting greenery. We have planted sunflowers throughout the neighbourhood.

There are nesting boxes in the neighbourhood for, among other things, tits, but also for swifts that return every year.

What can you as a neighbourhood resident do to promote biodiversity in our neighbourhood? Here are some ideas and we hope you get started:

- Remove tiles from your garden, every square meter counts, you can also remove a part.
- Sow or plant insect-attracting flowers/plants/shrubs.
- Did you know that flower bulbs are the first food for bees in early spring, so it's important: flower bulbs
- If you leave a corner with branches/leaf waste etc. in your garden, it is a great place for hedgehogs to get through the winter.
- Plant or sow the tree mirror of the tree in front of your door, which immediately makes the street more beautiful and cosier with the bees.
- Create a front garden, remove a row of tiles if you don't have a front garden.
- Make a "library" with plants and cuttings at your front door, then people can trade.

We sincerely hope that you will help to make our neighbourhood greener and more liveable.

With the "Goede Buren" project, the gardeners of Vegetable Garden Association De Rijt make selected neighbourhood residents happy with their surplus vegetables.

## Speeding in the neighbourhood
